THE BURROUGHS WELLCOME TOXICOLOGY SCHOLAR AWARD

Under the administration of the Society of Toxicology, The Burroughs Wellcome Fund offers a five-year Toxicology Scholar Award of \$200,000 to an individual working in the field of toxicology in a recognized U.S. school in the life sciences. The primary aim of the program is to support the career development of toxicologists and to stimulate teaching, training and research in academic institutions that have made a commitment to toxicology as a basic science.

The program is designed to help provide an increased number of toxicologists, well-trained in understanding the interactions of chemicals with biological systems. Selection is made on the basis of the demonstrated ability and potential of the candidate, the strength of the commitment for program expansion, the quality of expansion plans, and relative importance of the Award to the success of the proposed program expansion.

GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP AWARDS

Society of Toxicology Graduate Fellowship Awards are sponsored by Procter & Gamble Company and Hazleton Laboratories Corporation. The Procter & Gamble Company Fellowship is an \$8,000 stipend and the Hazleton Laboratories Corporation Fellowship is \$4,000. Any graduate student with at least two years of graduate study towards the Ph.D. degree in the area of toxicology and whose major professor is a member of the Society of Toxicology may apply. Evaluation by the Education Committee is based primarily on scholastic achievement, letters of recommendation and the dissertation research. Applications are due by December 15, 1984.

STUDENT TRAVEL GRANTS

Student Travel Grants are available on a one-time only basis to graduate students presenting papers or posters at the Annual Meeting. Support is limited to round-trip coach airfare. One award will be made per department or program, but awards may be given to more than one unit per university. Applications are due by November 15, 1984.
