II. Activities

2010 SOT Annual Meeting Reception was held Tuesday, March 9 at the Salt Lake City Convention Center, Utah. Approximately 60-80 people were in attendance.

Rick Corley called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM on March 9th. The meeting included announcements, introductions of new officers, presentation of the Perry J. Gehring Student Award for Excellence in Biological Modeling, and acknowledgement of corporate sponsors. The members heard an excellent presentation by keynote speaker, Chris Johnson, on image based biological modeling, simulation, and visualization. Dr. Johnson is a distinguished Professor at the University of Utah, Director of the Scientific Computing and Imaging Institute, and Co-director of the Center of Integrative Biomedical Computing at Utah.

Awards: The high quality of the applicant's work for the 2010 Perry J. Gehring Student Award for Excellence in Biological Modeling prompted two awards this year – Sheppard A. Martin for his poster titled presentation "Progress in Development of a Physiologically-based Pharmacokinetic Model for Aviation Fuels"; and Marc-André Verner for his poster titled "Unveiling Associations Between Lactational Exposure to Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) and Infant Neurological Development: Use of PBPK Modeling vs Traditional Exposure Metrics".

Honorable mentions were also given for the work of: Susan Ritger Crowell; Shuang Li; Anne E. Loccisano, and Thomas Peyret.
