### **II. Activities:**

**2017 SOT Annual Meeting Reception** was held in Baltimore, Maryland on Monday, March 13, 2017.

Approximately 55 people were in attendance.

Dr. Raymond Kemper called the meeting to order at 6 PM on Monday, March 13, 2017.

### **Meeting Minutes:**

The meeting opened with a welcome from out-going President Dr Ray Kemper and the award of the Emil A. Pfitzer Travel Award for best graduate student and post-doctoral poster presentations. A total of 16 submissions from graduate students and 4 submissions from post-doctoral fellows were received. All abstracts were reviewed and the top four candidates from each category were invited to present their posters for final judging on the afternoon of Monday, March 13th. Dr Yvonne Will then gave a presentation on the SOT Contemporary Concepts in Toxicology (CCT) Meetings. The aims of the CCT and the CTT committee were shared and details of how to create a CCT meeting and the support provided by the SOT.

In-coming President then welcomed the newly elected officers for 2016-2017 (Dinah Misner, – VP Elect, Jonathan, Marie Lemper – Secretary Treasurer, Jennifer Cohen – Councillor, Pankajini Mallick – Post-Doctoral representative and Guncha Taneja – Graduate Student Representative), and service plaques were presented to outgoing officers (Ray Kemper – President, Dinah Misner – Secretary Treasurer, and Jonathan Phillips – Councillor and Kshama Doshi – Graduate Student Representative). This was followed by a panel discussion led by Dr. Howard Mellor and Dr Peter Newham on Panel Discussion Discovery Toxicologist skills and capabilities. The panellists were Yvonne Will – Pfizer, Scott Henry – Ionis Pharma and Kathila Rajapaksa – Genentech,

representing small molecule, nucleotide-based and biologic therapeutics. This was an opportunity to compare and contrast the different philosophies and skills required for investigative toxicology in the drug discovery phase, how these have evolved in recent years and perceived skills gaps. The meeting finished with announcement of a new annual competition “Drug discovery toxicology paper of the year award”.

#### **Awards:**

##### **Graduate Students:**

1<sup>st</sup> place poster – Elijah J. Weber, University of Washington. Safety assessment of Polymyxin B structural variants using a 3D nephrotoxin-sensitive microphysiological system (\$1000).

2<sup>nd</sup> place poster – Wenyi Wang, Rutgers University. Design, Synthesis and Evaluation of Inhibitors of Type 5 17 $\beta$ -Hydroxysteroid Dehydrogenase (AKR1C3) as Novel Therapeutics to Manage Castration Resistant Prostate Cancer (CRPC) and Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML) (\$400).

3<sup>rd</sup> place poster – Tyler Beach, University of Rochester. Persistent and progressive lung injury is linked to recurring DNA damage, cellular senescence and a pro-fibrotic epithelial response (\$150).

##### **Post-Doctoral Fellows:**

1<sup>st</sup> place poster – Priyanka Trivedi, Brigham and Women’s Hospital. Targeting Phospholipase D4 attenuates kidney fibrosis by modulating the immune system and activating proteases (\$1000).

2<sup>nd</sup> place poster – Sarah E. Thacker, UNC Institute for Drug Safety Sciences. Optimization of Methods to Enrich Hepatocyte-Derived Exosomes for the Identification of Novel DILI Biomarkers (\$400).

3<sup>rd</sup> place postdoctoral poster – Li Xi, Texas A&M University. Hydroxyphenyl-bisindole Isomers as Specific Ligands for Nuclear Receptor 4A1 (NR4A1) (\$150).

**2017 SOT Annual Meeting Courses/Sessions:** DDTSS endorsed 1 CE course, 5 symposium sessions and 2 workshops for the 2017 annual meeting.

**Endowment Fund Details:** For the nine month period ending March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017, the Emil A. Pfitzer Drug Discovery Student Award Endowment showed a net gain of \$7,328, giving an ending balance of \$97,723.
