When putting together an abstract for SOT, keep in mind the following top reasons for rejection by the SOT Scientific Planning Committee. These include the following:

1. Test substance is not defined
2. The abstract is poorly written, including use of chemical abbreviations or uncommon jargon
3. Abstract promotes a commercial product and sounds like an advertisement for a company
4. The abstract is one of several emanating from a single study and cannot form a separate presentation
5. The abstract provides little data or is a literature review with no new interpretations or applications

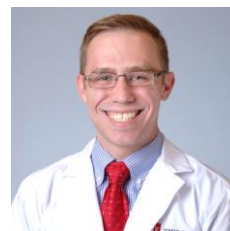

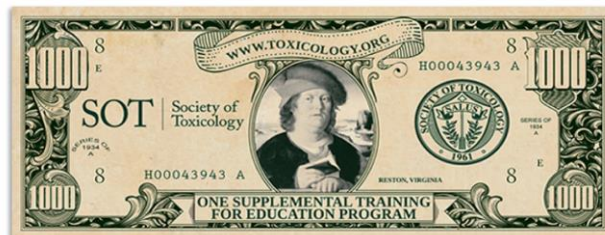

Eligibility requirements: (1) Undergraduates, Postbaccalaureates, Graduate Students, and Postdoctoral Fellows are eligible to apply. (2) Trainees must attend the 2020 SOT Annual meeting in order to accept the award. (3) Graduate Students and Postdoctoral Fellows must be members of NTSS or show evidence of application for membership. (4) Undergraduates and Post-Baccalaureates need not be NTSS members, but their submitted abstract must be neurotoxicology focused. 2020 Toshio Narahashi Poster Competition - February 13, 2020

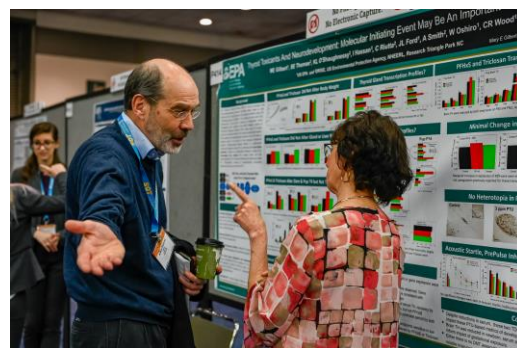
