Narahashi Neurotoxicology Fellowship Award Update:

NTSS is delighted to announce that the endowment drive for the Toshio Narahashi Fellowship Fund **has exceeded its original goal of raising \$25,000 by the end of December 2013**, which means that the proceeds of the fund will be available for NTSS use in perpetuity. NTSS expresses its sincere thanks to the donors who joined together to make this a reality. The fund is named to honor Dr. Toshio Narahashi's lifetime contribution and commitment, not only to neurotoxicology research, but also to training junior neurotoxicologists. This significant support from the fund will enable NTSS to continue the legacy of Prof. Narahashi for future graduate students and postdoctoral fellows and will be used to provide annual travel stipends to graduate students and postdoctoral fellows demonstrating outstanding neurotoxicology research.
