Stem Cells Specialty Section Annual Meeting Minutes

March 6, 2011

Reception and meeting were held at the Marriott Marquis, Yerba Buena Salon 4, San Francisco, CA. Dr. Michael Waalkes (SCSS President) called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM on March 14, 2012. Dr. Waalkes discussed the SCSS activities from the Section's first year. Dr. Waalkes then announced the newly elected officers and thanked the outgoing officers for their hard work in establishing the SCSS. Dr. Waalkes discussed following topics during business meeting:

Newly elected officers were introduced:

- VP Elect: Jingbo Pi
- Senior Councilor: Aaron Bowman

MSS Goals and Plans were discussed.

1. Membership Drive: The importance of continuing to increase the membership was emphasized. SCSS membership increased by 60% from 2011 (47 members in 2011 to 80 members in 2012). Goal: increase membership by $\geq 25\%$ by 2013. Challenge: every member bring in 1-2 new members by 2013 meeting.
2. Fund Drive: Goal is to establish Endowment Fund for Student/Postdoc Awards. Elsevier sponsored 2012 Student/Postdoc Awards. There were also \$1200 in donations from Chairperson funds from CE course (Stem Cells in Toxicology).
3. Program Drive: Goal is to sponsor and endorse several scientific sessions for 2013. Program committee will be established. SCSS sponsored 1 approved CE Course and Endorsed 1 approved Symposium Session.
4. Committees will be established for each Drive.

MSS program contributions were reviewed by Dr. Waalkes:

- CE Course (Sponsored): Stem Cells in Toxicology (Sunday morning). Chairs: Mike Waalkes and Erik Tokar. Speakers: Ying Xia, Mike Waalkes, R. Clark Lantz, Kyle Kolaja. Course was well-attended with approximately 200 attendees.
- Symposium Session (Endorsed): Off the Beaten Path: Preclinical Approaches to Safety Evaluation of Cells/Gene Therapy, Vaccines, and Adjuvants. Chairs: Drs. Black and Gould.

Programmatic themes and submission guidelines for SOT 2013 were presented by Dr. Waalkes. Tips for successful proposals were discussed. Submissions were solicited via sign-up sheets and/or emails.
