Stem Cells Specialty Section Annual Meeting Minutes

March 14, 2017

Reception and meeting were held at the Hilton Baltimore in Baltimore, MD. Dr. Erik Tokar (SCSS President) called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM on Monday, March 14, 2017. Dr. Tokar discussed the SCSS activities and then announced the newly-elected officers and thanked the outgoing officers for their hard work. The following topics were discussed during business meeting:

SCSS Goals and Plans were discussed.
