





2025 AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

The Exposure Specialty Section (ESS) is soliciting applications for awards! Awards will be presented at the 2025 Annual Meeting. ESS sponsors individual Graduate Student and Postdoc Travel Awards (\$500 each). Applications are due by **January 15th, 2025** and can be submitted using the [SOT Apply platform](#). See below and on our website for more information about each award.

ESS BEST OVERALL ABSTRACT

Eligibility: Any abstract accepted by SOT for the Annual Meeting which indicates an application of exposure science with regards to toxicology. Abstracts will be evaluated based on the exposure assessment or methodology focus, scientific quality and significance of the research project, impact and/or novelty of the findings and written quality of the abstract. Submissions do not need to be from members of the Exposure Specialty Section.

Application Materials: All accepted abstracts will be reviewed, but to ensure consideration, please include "exposure" as a keyword during submission and, after acceptance, self-nominate any abstracts by submitting your abstract through the SOT Apply platform. The ESS will use keyword search terms to identify additional candidates from the SOT accepted abstract database.

ESS BEST PUBLICATION

Eligibility: All publications by an SOT member (first and/or last author) accepted by a peer-reviewed journal and in the field of exposure science with regards to toxicology are eligible. Publications with acceptance dates from December 1, 2023 through December 1, 2024 are eligible. Publications will be evaluated based on the exposure assessment or methodology focus, scientific quality and significance of the research project, impact and/or novelty of the findings and written quality of the publication. Submissions do not need to be from members of the Exposure Specialty Section, but either the first or last author should be SOT members.

Application Materials: Nominate papers by submitting citation information. The ESS Executive Committee will identify additional candidates through literature review.

ESS STUDENT & POSTDOCTORAL TRAVEL AWARDS

Eligibility: Any student or postdoc who is the presenting author of an abstract submitted to SOT for the Annual Meeting which indicates an application of exposure science with regards to toxicology. Abstracts will be evaluated based on the exposure assessment or methodology focus, scientific quality and significance of the research project, impact and/or novelty of the findings, written quality of the abstract, and stated need by the candidate. The student award is available to individuals who have completed a bachelor's degree and are enrolled in a program leading to second bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree. Applicants must be members of SOT or show evidence of their application for SOT membership. Applicants are strongly encouraged to join the ESS.

Application Materials: Electronic copy of 2025 SOT abstract, proof of status as student or postdoc researcher (letter from advisor), 200-word statement on how work advances field of exposures science, 100-word statement on travel funding need.
