Also newly elected council members for 2009-2010 were invited to attend: Mike Dourson, Vice-President elect, Cynthia Rider, post-doc rep and Ron Pringle, student rep, and Bruce Fowler, new councilor, could not attend.

Updates on the following:

Officer responsibilities – need to lay out procedures since not really spelled out in By-Laws. Use members who were not running for office to work on MSS activities. Make use of past presidents in future. President set up and use presidential chain; VP-elect handles awards. By-Laws review by past president. VP handles program planning for next SOT.

Newsletter – did not get off the ground. Cynthia will take the lead for now. Send example to her.

Logo contest – no one submitted. Mention at reception. Sami will try it again. Will establish due date – 2 months after first newsletter is an option.

Increasing membership – need to increase membership. Need list of webinar attendees and attendees at CE course. Workshop will also ask for membership by dropping off business

card. Try to have more webinars – asked for 100-200 lines. Need one page submission to SOT. Ask award winner to make presentation.

Awards- sponsorship and procedures – Wiley will sponsor general abstract award if we put their name on the award. We select abstract. Post-doc award – keep as separate category and use post-doc assembly to advertise category. No sponsor at this time. VP-elect will set up review committee which could be ad hoc (must be MSS member) or council members (5).

Nomination procedure – see above.

By-law revisions – need to update especially duties. Duties to nominees. Post doc and student reps.

Meeting and reception tonight at 6:00pm – Jan has agenda. Formal meeting at 6:30.

Program submissions – are due soon. Need to meet later this week or by telecom.

Established Guidelines for Best Abstract Award:

Committee Chairpersons and Committee Members: can have abstracts in the competition. However, they should not score the abstracts on which they are co-authors.

Collaborators: If a committee member has collaborated in the research work or funded the work described in an abstract, s/he should not score the abstract.

Supervisors: If the committee member is the current supervisor of one or more co-authors of an abstract being evaluated, s/he should not score the abstract.

Institution: Best judgment will be applied in recommending recusal when a colleague from the same institution is nominated. The decision regarding recusal will take into account the size of the institution and the proximity in the management structure.

Winner: The winner of the Best Abstract Award is based on the average score among all who scored the abstract, not the total numerical score
