## EMERITUS MEMBERS

A Full or Associate member of the Society who has maintained membership continuously for 40 years will become an Emeritus member unless he or she declines. Emeritus members shall retain their privileges of membership, will not pay dues, and will receive the journal electronically. See page 23 for a current listing of Emeritus members.

## RETIRED MEMBERS

A Full or Associate member of the Society who has retired from active work in toxicology may be accorded **retired status** upon approval of SOT Council. Retired members shall retain their privileges of membership and be relieved of the payment of their dues not used for subscription to a Society journal; or of their entire dues if they do not wish to continue receiving a journal that was included with the dues.

## HONORARY MEMBERS

Honorary membership shall be awarded by the Society to persons who are not members of the Society in recognition of outstanding and sustained achievements in toxicology. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues and shall not be eligible to hold office or any elective position in the Society, but shall have all the non-voting privileges of the Society in scientific proceedings.
