EMERITUS MEMBERS

A Full or Associate member of the Society who has maintained membership continuously for 40 years will become an Emeritus member unless he or she declines. Emeritus members shall retain their privileges of membership, will not pay dues, and will receive the journal electronically. See page 25 for a current listing of Emeritus members.

RETIRED MEMBERS

A Full or Associate member of the Society who has retired from active work in toxicology may be accorded **retired status** upon approval of SOT Council. Retired members shall retain their privileges of membership and be relieved of the payment of their dues not used for subscription to the Society journal; or of their entire dues if they do not wish to continue receiving the journal that was included with the dues.

HONORARY MEMBERS

Honorary membership shall be awarded by the Society to persons who are not members of the Society in recognition of outstanding and sustained achievements in toxicology. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues and shall not be eligible to hold office or any elective position in the Society, but shall have all the nonvoting privileges of the Society in scientific proceedings. Use the Online Membership Application Process

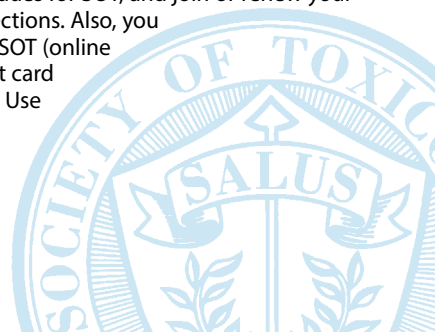

Membership Information

Membership Renewal—Go online to pay or renew your membership dues for SOT, and join or renew your membership in Regional Chapters, Special Interest Groups, and Specialty Sections. Also, you can pay for subscriptions to *Toxicological Sciences*, the official journal of the SOT (online access is included in Full and Associate member fees). You may pay by credit card or print your customized Dues Form to submit your payment by mail or fax. Use the online module at any time to check on membership dues status.

Manage Your Membership Information—Make changes to your contact information, password, and communications preferences through the online module. Your profile information automatically populates from the online *Membership Directory* when using electronic forms and ToXchange on the SOT website.



Join or Upgrade Your Membership in the Society of Toxicology

Take a moment to see if the next level of membership in the Society is for you!

Graduate Student Members—If you have recently received your doctoral degree, you may want to take advantage of the next level of membership in the Society as either a Postdoctoral or Associate member.

Postdoctoral Members—If you have recently completed your postdoctoral training, you may want to consider applying for either Associate or Full membership in the Society.

Associate Members—If, since your acceptance as an Associate member, you now meet the criteria for Full membership based on either publications or experience, you may want to consider applying for Full membership in the Society.

Apply for Postdoctoral membership if...

...you are now a postdoctoral researcher holding a PhD or equivalent doctorate (e.g., MD, DVM) with an interest in toxicology who is currently under the direction of a research mentor. Candidates require only a letter from their research advisor attesting to their postdoctoral status.

Apply for Associate membership if...

...you are currently engaged in professional scientific activities with an interest in toxicology and do not yet qualify for Full membership based on publications or years' experience. Candidates require letters of sponsorship by two Full members of the Society.

Apply for Full membership if...

...you have published two peer-reviewed articles relating to toxicology not resulting from your doctoral research or you meet the years' experience (up to 5/8/10 years since doctoral /masters/bachelors degree). Candidates meeting the criteria for publications require letters of sponsorship by two Full members of the Society; those meeting the criteria for experience require letters of sponsorship by three Full members of the Society.

Please use the SOT online membership application form to apply to upgrade your membership to Postdoctoral, Associate, or Full member status. Membership applications for 2014 will be reviewed by the Membership Committee beginning in September 2013. Application deadlines are September 1, 2013, January 1, 2014, and May 1, 2014.
